RECORD OF MINUTES

December 13, 2022

The Board of Education of the Public Schools of Calumet, Laurium and Keweenaw held its regular monthly meeting on December 13, 2022, at 5:30 p.m., in the Board of Education Room.

The General Fund showed a bank balance of \$430,863.53, plus a Money Market of \$2,152,907.18, less outstanding checks of (\$258,930.12), less a Transfer in Transit (ORS) of (\$127,477.62), for a total General Fund balance as of November 30, 2022,

of \$2,197,362.97

The Athletic Account showed a bank balance as of November 30, 2022, of \$55,469.86, for a total Athletic Fund of \$55,469.86.

The Cafeteria Fund showed a balance of \$58,844.43, for a total School Service Fund balance of \$115,314.29.

The Bond Debt Retirement Fund showed a bank balance of \$1,730,509.50, for a total Debt Retirement Fund balance as of November 30, 2022, of \$1,730,509.50.

The Capital Bond Projects Fund showed a bank balance of 28,200.26, plus a MILAF Investment of \$245,190.06, less a transfer in transit (General Fund) of (\$1,749.00) for a total Capital Bond Projects Fund balance as of November 30, 2022, of \$271,641.32.


